1. Call to Order

2. <u>Good News and Recognitions</u>

- 6. <u>Superintendent's Report</u>
 - a. <u>Vacancies, nominations, recommendations</u>

ON A MOTION BY Goff French, seconded by Peggy Lovejoy, the Board voted to approve nomination pages one and two. (817 yes)

b. <u>Update on Assessment Payments from Towns</u>

The Superintendent shared that as of January 19, 2017, all six towns were current on their monthly assessment payments. January assessments, which are due on the 20th, were outstanding for Canaan, Mercer, Norridgewock, Skowhegan and Smithfield. Cornville's assessment payment for January was received.

c. <u>Other</u>

The Superintendent shared the following:

- Revolving Renovation Fund, if accepted, will need to go to a bond referendum. The Support Services Committee will discuss the options further at their next meeting.
- The District did not receive approval for federal funding to continue the After School Program. We will reapply for Century 21 Grant in April and in the meantime, the elementary and middle school programs will continue providing one to two nights per week.
- Preliminary 2017-2018 budget work continues. Highlights of the Governor's budget in regard to public education were shared, some of which include:
 - Providing Incentives for Voluntary Regionalization Efforts

- Fund regional education service agencies to reduce administrative costs
- Incentivize grassroots, voluntary regional efforts
- Repeal the current EPS formula and replace it to provide funding to districts for direct instruction, accountability and teachers
- Statewide teacher contract that would fund a minimum salary and benefits for statewide teachers
- Adjust student-teacher ratios for smaller class size in K-3 and larger class size in higher grades
- The 2017-2018 draft calendar will be shared and reviewed by the SCTC surrounding districts and the Education Association.
- The first Unified basketball game will be held at the Skowhegan Area High School on January 20th at 4:00 p.m.
- The Finance Committee will meet with the District's auditors on February 2nd at 6:00 p.m., prior to the Board meeting, to review the 2016 audit report.

7. <u>Assistant Superintendent and Support Services Manager</u>

The Assistant Superintendent updated the Board on activities taking places in each of the schools.

The Assistant Superintendent also reported on the following:

- Ongoing observations in the classrooms continue and have been very positive.
- Substitute Teacher/Ed Tech hiring continues. The District did make adjustments to substitute pay to help attract quality applicants.
- Professional development is continuing for staff, especially those members of the vertical curriculum committees. Trainings specific to our curriculum development, the build out of the requirements for graduation and Proficiency Based Education, with focus on scoring criteria and assessment continue.
- PEPG work on new evaluation plan continues as the District works through the last pilot year of the State's required new evaluation rollout.
- Artist in Schools program will take place for grades 3-6 on February 7th at SAHS.

The Support Services Manager reported that his office is working on 2017-2018 budget draft, capital improvement application, as well as gathering information for various bids for snow plowing and pellets that will go out this year.
