# c. MSMA Fall Conference Reminder

- As of this date, 91% of the District's budget is remaining.

- Will be attending the upcoming Drummond Woodsum Law Seminar, which will include FMLA and School Construction.
- The current enrollment is 2,445, which includes 101 PreK students.
